AHASCRAGH DISPENSARY DISTRICT.

The Sewerage is defective at Ahascragh. Nuisances are caused by accumulations of manure too close to the dwellings in the District.

The water supply of the District is good, except in Mackney Village.

LAWRENCETOWN DISPENSARY DISTRICT.

These are firstprinciples in the administration of public works, and the problem that then presents itself is the attainment of the object indicated. From the experience of other counties it is established that the only way to maintain your roads and works properly is by a Direct Labour Scheme well devised and superintended. The Contract Skystem now, as it has always been, is effete, full of abuses and ineffective. The small contractor is no longer able to provide the requisite labour to carry out his undertaking, and the men available for this work will not go to him Now I maintain that under a Direct Labour Scheme the difficulties that confront the small contractor, do not appear. Everyone recognises that men will work for a Body such as The Co. Council who will not touch a private individual.

The heaviest portion of the County work is during the late Autump Winter, and early Spring, and this time synchronises with th slack season in the country. The small farmers will thus have employment at a time when they have little else to do and when they will be glad of an opportunity to earn a little.

It is time the Ballinasloe Council gave the subject of Direc Labour their consideration, and it is with a view to your having discussion on it that I have thus dealt with the arguments at so length.

and the "Treasurer's Advice Note for making payments' for the respective amounts was duly signed.

Letter from the Local Covernment Board No. 35,786: 1915 dated 30th. June, 1915 referring to previous correspondence on the subject and informing the Council that they have sanctioned the appointment of Mr. T. J. Gill as Executive Sanitary Officer in the Rural District at a salary at the rate of £15. 12. 0. a year as proposed by the Council, and enclosing a copy of the Board's Sanitary Order No. 1 of the 3rd. May, 1900.

Read a letter from the Congested Districts Board dated the 10th. July, 1915 referring to the Council's minute of the 26th. ultimo and informing the Council that there is an ample supply of water for the tenants on the Gortnaraheen farm.

AUGHRIM NEW BURIAL GROUND.

Read a letter from Messrs Hayden & Taylor dated the 31st. July, 1915 stating that they have gone very carefully in to the above, and advising the Council to take the alternative site. The one selected at the end of the field would not, in their opinion be sanctioned by the Local Government Board there being two cottages already on the lands : the putting of a site for a grave-yard also on the same field would be deemed to interfere with the Occupiers' interest. The alternative Site is more convenient to Aughrim, and placing the Site beside the wall already bounding the cottage sites and having a shorter frontage would mean a saving of about £100 to the Council, and dispenses with. at least two Lecal Government Board inquiries, and that no Provisional Order or confirming Act of Parliament will be required. As to the financing of the Scheme they would suggest to borrow the amount required from the Bank of Ireland, and have its repayment spread over a period of years repayable by annual instalments with the sanction of the Local Government Board.

THE COUNCIL HAVING APPROVED OF THE ALTERNATIVE SITE, LEFT THE MATTER IN THE HANDS OF Mess' HAYDEN & TAYLOR, THEY TO COMMUNICATE WITH THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD ON THE SUBJECT.

Mr. Dunne the Council's Engineer submitted map showing the original site and alternative site of the Aughrim new Burial Ground and the approximate cost of fencing the alternative site would be £251. 17. 8.

PROPOSED PUMP & WELL AT LISSEYEGAN.

Mr. Dunne submitted map showing site for above, selected by the Committee on the 4th, instant and stating that water should be obtained at a depth of about 30 feet.

ORDERED/- THAT ADVERTISEMENT BE ISSUED TO CONTRACTORS FOR THE SINKING OF A WELL AND ERECTING A PUMP, TENDERS TO BE CONSIDERED AT THE NEXT MEETING OF THE COUNCIL.

The Engineer Mr. Dunne reported on the following works in the District:-

LOUGHTOURK WELL.

"The Contractor has made good progress with this work, and the well "is now lined and ready for erection of pump."

CALLOW WELL.

"The Contractors have reached a depth of 21 feet, 17 of which is "through rock, but have not yet reached water."

LISCUNE WELL.

"This well has been sunk to a depth of 8 feet and the amount of "water met with is delaying the sinking considerably, the Contractor "has ordered a pump to keep well cleared out while sinking."

CAPPAGH WELL.

"Fair progress has been made with the work of boring at Cappagh Well
"a fair amount of water has been met with, and I am arranging to have a
"test made next week if possible to ascertain if the supply is sufficient"

GORTYROYAN PUMP.

The flooring of enclosure to Gortyroyan pump has been repaired."

KILCONNELL SEWERS.

"The Contractor has completed his contract, but I would suggest "that the gullet near the pound be extended for a distance of 14 yards "towards the School the cost of the extension would be about £5."

THAT THE WORK BE ADVERTISED.

Read a letter from Mr. John Kinneen Dunsandle Athenry dated the 29th. July, 1915 stating that on opening the Sewer in Mr. Joseph Callanan's yard last week, it was found to be choked up and requires cleaning. Sub-Sanitary Officer Hession also reported that it was in a very bad state.

Letter from the Local Government Board No. 6684:1915 dated the 19th. July, 1915 referring to the Councils Minutes of the 26th. ultimo, relative to the arrears of rent due by John Kelly in respect of the cottage which he holds from the Council under the Labourers Acts, and stating that they have had before them the facts concerning Kelly's tenancy, and in view of these facts of the case, and having regard to the expense in which this tenant has involved the Council, and his repeated failure to pay his rent the Board decline to acquiesce in the Council's proposal to forego the arrears in this case: but on the payment by Kelly of all rent and arrears in full, the Board will be prepared to consider the question of the rent of his cottage.
