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

The odours of course ascend and may when the windows and doors are opened enter the wards above and thus disease may easily spread amongst the patients in the upper wards. This seems now to be generally known and is commonly spoken of in no friendly terms. It would it not then be well and in compliance with the Statues of The Poor Saw to erect a fever Hospital distinct from but convenient to the present Hospital and have a paid Rurse appointed to take charge of it. If this cannot now be conveniently done he would respectfully suggest that the House known as The Iron House be utilized for that purpose Trusting that this communication will be promptly
