The Medical Officer of Health Loughrea reported upon the unsatisfactory state of Cross Street Loughrea from the gully being stopped and flowing into houses by the great danger of the health of the inhabitants & the Clerk was directed to transmit a copy of the report to Mr Kempter County Surveyor and request his attention thereto.

Sanitary Officer Norris was directed to employ men and have the sewers from the Mountains in Loughrea opened and cleaned out.
