Messrs Patrick Blake and Michael Connolly were duly proposed and seconded for the vacant office

The voting being 5 for each candidate no appointment could be made and the following minute was ordered to be submitted for consideration of The Local Government Board

For the office of Registrar of Deaths &c in Athenry which came on to day and which vacancy had not been previously advertised there was only one application namely that of Mr Blake - but one of the Guardians proposed Mr Michael Connolly Relieving Officer who had not however sent in an application - the question was raised whether his appointment could be considered under the circumstances and The Chairman declining to make any ruling in the case not knowing what his powers were The two names were put to the poll with the result that the voting was a tie Five Members voting for each candidate

Under the circumstances the Board wish to ask The Local Government Board whether either of these candidates is properly elected as the time for the appointment will have expired before the next meeting of the Board unless the time is extended
