Medical Officers Report.

That in compliance with the directions of the  
Letter of the L. G. B. of the 3<sup>rd</sup> March a copy of which  
he received from the Clerk, he (S<sup>r</sup> O'Donaghue) begs to  
inform the Board that for the past 3 years the  
daily average number of patients in the Infirmary  
was very nearly forty four.

In the year 1896 on the 14<sup>th</sup> January, 6<sup>th</sup> June and 7<sup>th</sup> November the daily numbers in the Infirmary were respectively, 45, 33, & 47. In 1897 on the corresponding on the corresponding dates the numbers were 48, 36 and 45. In 1898 on similar dates 44, 41 and 40. It is to be remembered that each of these patients requires nursing as I never retain persons who are merely old or infirm.

The night nursing is done single-handed by a trained nurse. At present the day nursing is ~~done~~ attended to by a three runs, and two paid female helpers, the day trained nurse having resigned, on which I wrote to the Clerk to call the attention of the guardians to the want of a nurse, obstetrical and surgical. In  
answer



answer to the paragraphs (A) and (B) I beg to say  
 I am of opinion that for day nursing, in addition  
 to the trained Nurses a trained Nurse four female  
 paid helpers and one paid male helper are required  
 For night nursing in addition to the trained  
 Nurse I recommend that a paid helper be appointed
