We the undersigned members of the tisiting Committee inspected portion of the House on Saturday last and beg to report: That we found the Ventilation in the old men's Dormitory very defective, the place intolerably hot and stuffy, so much so that we found it difficult to remain in the room during the few henates we were inspecting it. we believe this want of proper ventilation must be very injurious to the health of the occupants of this room and are of opinion that at night lime it must be unbearable there are two windows in the room, one in front and one at the back, about onefourth of the window at the back can be opened. This is the ventilation . The one in front, - a fine large window in a splended position overlooking the lake, is unfortunately fastened up and cannot be opened.

We beg to recommend to the Board that this window should be made to open and admet the fresh air, and we are of opinion that the opening of this window, which could be

done at a small cost, would ventilate the place thoroughly and be very beneficial to the health, and add greatly to the comfort of the inmates.
